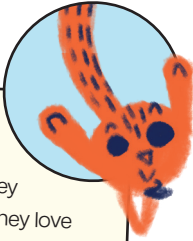


Kinkajou

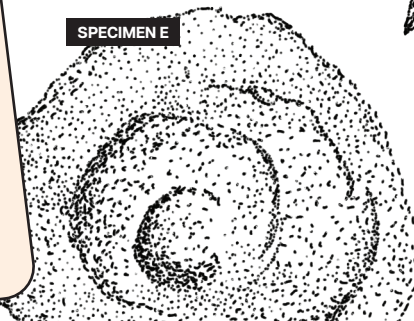
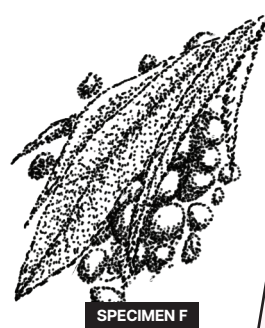
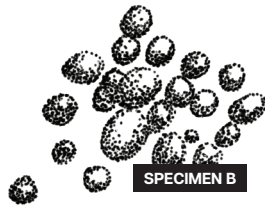
Cow

- **Poop:** big, round, flat patties. Soft and squishy!



Sloth

- Move about as fast as a crawling baby.
- Spend most of their time hanging upside down in trees!
- Sleep up to 20 hours a day.
- Only poop about once a week!
- **Poop:** collection of small, dark, pebble-like pieces which they bury beneath grass and leaves.



Pangolin

- Found in Africa and Asia.
- Only mammals with scales: They kinda look like walking pine cones!
- Love to eat ants and termites with their long, sticky tongues.
- Baby pangolins sometimes ride on their mom's tail!
- **Poop:** small, crumbly, oval pellets packed with ants or termites!



Goat

- Goat milk can be sold, drank or turned into cheese, butter and yogurt.
- Baby goats are called kids, just like human children!
- Have amazing balance. They can climb trees and even balance on the sides of cliffs.
- **Poop:** round pellets like little marbles or peas.
